This year's festival theme, "The Spirit of Harmony," sets the stage for a dynamic lineup of artist concerts, jazz clinics and workshops, and more.

The Lionel Hampton Jazz Festival is a not-to-miss educational event featuring student performances, hands-on clinics and professional workshops.
